Milford manufacturer and custom metal fabricator Burners Inc. was recently featured on two episodes of the new Discovery Channel show, "Motor City Motors," currently being filmed in Detroit.

Burners appeared twice this month on an episode called "The Asphalter" and then again on the "Corn Stalker" episode.

"The general theme for the Motown series of Motor City Motors is outrageous, yet functional, vehicle conversions," explained Scott Bockelman, engineering manager for Burners. "Our initial participation was providing our products for an automated, mobile, asphalt melter for patching potholes in roads.

"Since one of our core products that we manufacture here in Milford is propane combustion devices and controls, our involvement was a good fit. Our burners were used to melt the asphalt, and we added some pyrotechnics purely for flame effect on 'The Asphalter,' and Burners, Inc. burners were used to create the grill in the back of the truck on the 'Corn Stalker.' "
